The Legacy of Rome


- Main idea:
 - Rome passed on many achievements in government, law, language, and the arts to future generations.
- Our world would be very <u>different</u> if the Roman Empire had never <u>existed</u>.
- The same is true for our system of <u>laws</u> and our knowledge about <u>construction</u>.

Roman Influence on Architecture and Building

- Early Romans borrowed architectural ideas from the <u>Greeks</u>, but they also developed their own <u>style</u>.
- Roman designs often included <u>vaults</u>, <u>columns</u>, <u>domes</u>, and <u>arches</u>.
- New architectural ideas meant that buildings could be <u>constructed</u> in brand new ways.
- Because of <u>concrete</u> and a new design, <u>Roman</u> theaters did not have to be built on natural <u>slopes</u> to have tier seating...early <u>Greek</u> theaters are only found on <u>slopes</u>.
- Columns, domes, and arches still appear in many modern buildings.
- Banks, homes, and government buildings often use a Roman style.


















Greek theater

Roman Influence on Government

- Roman ideas about <u>law</u>, as first written in the <u>Twelve Tables</u>, are with us today.
- We, like the Romans, believe that people are <u>equal</u> under the law and should be treated fairly.
- We expect our <u>judges</u> to decide cases fairly and we consider a person <u>innocent</u> until proven <u>guilty</u>.
- Roman ideas about government and <u>citizenship</u> are also important today in the US.
- Like early Romans, Americans believe that a <u>republic</u> made up of equal citizens is the best form of <u>government</u>.
- We also believe that a republic works best if citizens do their <u>duty</u>, participate in government, and work to make a better <u>society</u>.

Roman Influence on Culture

- Today the <u>alphabet</u> of the Latin language, which expanded from 22 to 26 letters, is used throughout the <u>Western World</u>.
- <u>Latin</u> shaped the languages of Italy, France, Spain, Portugal, and Romania
- Many <u>English</u> words also come from Latin.
- <u>Scientists</u>, <u>doctors</u>, and <u>lawyers</u> still use Latin phrases throughout the daily lives.
- Every known species of <u>plants</u> and <u>animals</u> has a Latin name.
- Today, we also still admire the works of Roman <u>writers</u> such as Virgil, Horace, Livy, and Tacitus.

Roman Influence on Religion

- As you probably know, <u>Christianity</u> is one of the major religions in the world today.
- Christianity really <u>began</u> in the Roman Empire.
- When Rome's government adopted Christianity in the 300s CE, it helped the new <u>religion</u> to grow and spread.
- After Rome's fall, many Roman <u>ideas</u> blended with those of Christianity.
