
7.31 Analyze the rise of a military society in the late twelfth century and the role of the shogun and samurai in that society

#### The Emperor Loses Power

- By the 1100s, the emperor of Japan's power was greatly <u>weakened</u> by civil war.
- Noble families refused to pay <u>taxes</u> to the emperor.
- They grew rich and bought much <u>land</u>.
- Eventually, one noble family grew more <u>powerful</u> than any other.
- Noble families did not want to <u>obey</u> the emperor.
- They wanted <u>power</u>.

#### Feudalism

- A system of <u>feudalism</u> arose in Japan.
- In a feudal society, <u>land</u> is exchanged for <u>military</u> service.
- Japanese <u>lords</u> gave away some of their <u>land</u> to other people in exchange for loyalty and <u>military</u> service.



#### The Shogun

- The <u>leader</u> of Japan's most powerful family forced the emperor to appoint him <u>shogun</u>.
- The word "shogun" means "great general"
- For the next <u>700</u> years, powerful shoguns governed Japan.
- The shogun said he ruled in the <u>emperor's</u> name.
- In fact, the shogun was a <u>military</u> dictator who controlled Japan.









#### The Daimyo

- The <u>daimyo</u> were Japanese lords or <u>nobles</u>.
- The daimyo had to obey the <u>shogun</u> and provide <u>military</u> service.
- The daimyo controlled large <u>estates</u>. They were great <u>landowners</u>.
- They were the <u>highest</u> nobles next to the shogun.



# The Rise of the Samurai

- The need for the <u>samurai</u> came from the need of the daimyo to have <u>protection</u> for their land and property.
- The word samurai comes from the Japanese word for <u>servant</u>.
- Most samurai came from <u>noble</u> families and were required to be <u>loyal</u> to the emperor.
- Only the most <u>powerful</u> samurai received <u>land</u> for their service.

## Becoming a Samurai

- Young men and even some young women trained to become samurai warriors
- Their training included learning the art of war and later the way of peace
- Training included strict demand of the martial arts

### Becoming a Samurai

- Many developed great skill handling a <u>sword</u> but also proper way to conduct a <u>tea</u> <u>ceremony</u> and <u>writing poetry</u>
- Above all, trained to overcome fear of <u>death</u>
- Had to follow the <u>Code of Bushido</u>
- A samurai had to be loyal to his <u>daimyo</u> and show no <u>emotion</u>
