


The Arabian Peninsula

- Very harsh <u>desert</u> environment. Very little <u>water</u>
- The people there become very <u>fierce</u> as they compete for scarce <u>resources</u> like water
- Villages grow up around an <u>oasis</u>--places where water naturally comes up out of the <u>ground</u>
- Villages along <u>trade routes</u> between Africa, Asia, and Europe grow and prosper



The Arabian Peninsula

- Most people are <u>nomadic</u> shepherds called Bedouins
 - o Bedouins are <u>polytheistic</u>
- Bedouin people are often called <u>Arabs</u>, especially after they cease being nomadic
- According to legend, the ancestor of the Arabs is <u>Ishmael</u>, Abraham's illegitimate son by his wife's slave
- Arabs therefore claim the same origins as the <u>Hebrews</u>
