Hundred Years War

- 1337-1453 (actually 116 years)
- France v. England
- Began as a fight about who would be the French king
- Continued as fight for land, control of trade goods, and over who would rule France
- Mostly fought in France
- Many battles--both sides won some, lost some
- Who won in the end?
 - France!

Hundred Years War

- Results:
 - Unification of France: became more of a nation, rather than a group of feudal states
 - Popularity of the English longbow
 - Strengthened French power



Henry V (5th)

- King of England from 1413-1422
- First king to actually speak English since the Norman invasion in 1066
- Responsible for winning several key battles in France, including Agincourt
- Was briefly king of France
- Died in 1422 of battlefield dysentery



Joan of Arc

- French peasant girl
- Heard and saw visions from God
- Convinced the king of France to let her help lead an army
- Helped save city of Orleans and the French
- Eventually captured by the British
- Even with no evidence, she was burned at the stake as a heretic
