King Henry VIII (8th)

- Became king of <u>England</u> in 1509
- Renaissance Man: <u>athletic</u>, educated, <u>artistic</u>, musician, spoke many <u>languages</u>
- Brought artists, philosophers, and <u>writers</u> to England
- Wanted a <u>son</u>, but could not have one...wanted a <u>divorce</u>.
 Church said <u>no</u>.

King Henry VIII (8th)

- Started his own church--Church of England
- Eventually married <u>6</u> different women. Had one <u>son</u>, Edward, who died.
- Three <u>legitimate</u> children: Mary, Elizabeth, Edward

King Henry VIII





Mary I (Bloody Mary)

- Became <u>queen</u> when brother <u>Edward</u> died
- Remained <u>Catholic</u> like mom, Catherine of Aragon
- Returned <u>England</u> to Catholic Church
- Known for <u>burning heretics</u> at the stake
- Married Philip of Spain; No children
- Locked up sister <u>Elizabeth</u> out of fear

Bloody Mary Tudor





Elizabeth I (The Virgin Queen)

- Daughter of Henry VIII and Anne Boleyn (<u>beheaded</u>)
- Became <u>queen</u> after sister Mary <u>died</u>
- Immediately returned England to the <u>Church of England</u> (protestant)
- Known as the "Virgin Queen" because she never married
- Patron of artists like <u>Shakespeare</u> and major explorers like Drake and Raleigh
- Strong <u>ruler</u> who defeated the <u>Spanish Armada</u>

Queen Elizabeth I





Spanish Armada

- Philip II of Spain wanted England <u>Catholic</u> again so sent 131 ships to <u>attack</u>
- England had less than 1/2 that number
- Sir Francis Drake headed English navy and won
- Results:
 - Independent England
 - England as a <u>major naval power</u>
