Wealth and the Catholic Church

- People had to <u>pay</u> for church activities like baptisms, marriages, burials
- People were expected to pay a <u>tithe</u> (tax) of 10% of their income
- Church raised money by selling <u>relics</u> (bones of saints), selling <u>indulgences</u> (salvation to heaven), and pilgrimages

Protestant Reformation

- Before Reformation, all <u>Christians</u> in Western Europe were <u>Roman Catholic</u>
- <u>Reformation</u> was an attempt to change the Catholic Church
- People wanted to get rid of the <u>corruption</u> and restore people's <u>faith</u> in the Church
- In the end, reformers established their own <u>religions</u>
- Caused a <u>split</u> in Christianity with the formation of new <u>Protestant</u> religions
