7.5 Trace the origins of Islam and the life and teachings of Muhammad, including Islam's historical connections to **Judaism and Christianity**

Muhammad (Mohammed, Muhammad)

- Muhammad was born into this harsh Arab/Bedouin culture around <u>570 CE</u>
- He was born in <u>Mecca</u> and became a wealthy <u>merchant</u>
- He was famous for being wise and very <u>spiritual</u>
- One day Muhammad was visited by the angel <u>Gabriel</u> who told him that Muhammad is to be God's <u>prophet</u>
- Gabriel recited the <u>Qur'an</u> (Koran) to Muhammad to <u>memorize</u> since Muhammad was illiterate





Islam

- Means "<u>submission</u>" (to God)
- People who practice <u>Islam</u> are called <u>Muslims</u>, which means "one who submits" (to God)
- Muslims believe that <u>Muhammad</u> is the last prophet, but not the only one.
- Previous prophets include all the Jewish and Christian prophets – like <u>Moses</u> and even <u>Jesus</u> (they do not believe he is God's son)

Islam = <u>religion</u> Muslim = a person who practices Islam

Islam

- "People of the Book"
 - <u>Christianity</u> and <u>Judaism</u> are viewed as a precursor to Islam
 - They are allowed to practice their <u>faith</u>, but they are encouraged to <u>convert</u> to Islam
 - If they do not convert, they must pay a <u>tax</u>
 (jizyah or tribute)
