

7.62 Describe the accomplishments of major Enlightenment thinkers, including Locke and Charles-Louis Montesquieu

Background

- Parliament vs the king:
 - 1520s: King Charles I refused to accept limits on power. Led to civil war and execution
 - 1688: King James II opposed Parliament trying to limit power; went to exile
 - 1689: William and Mary come to power in “Glorious Revolution”



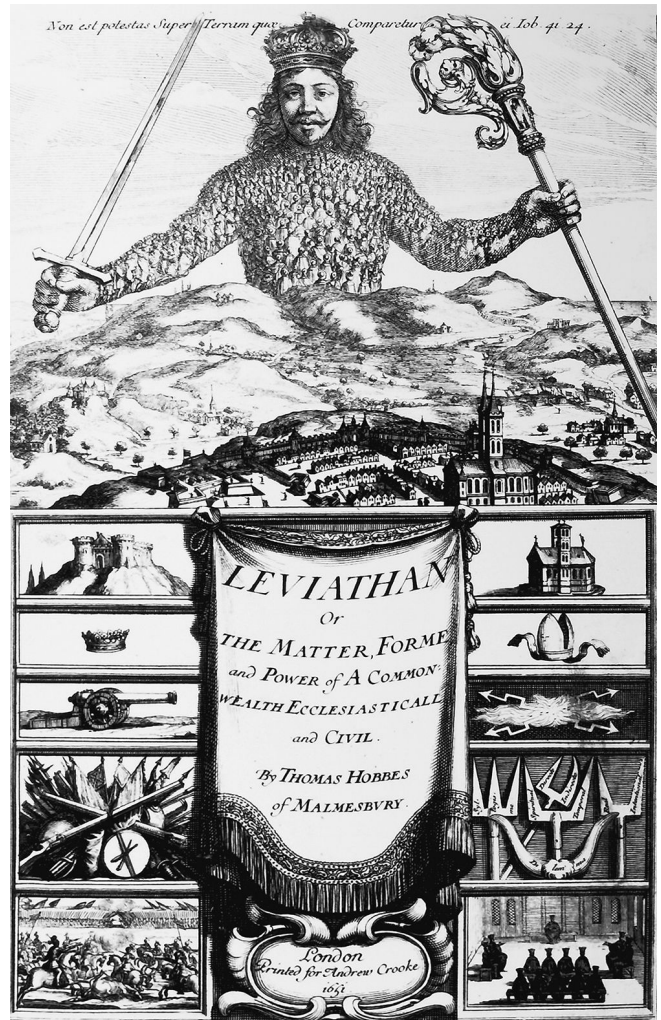
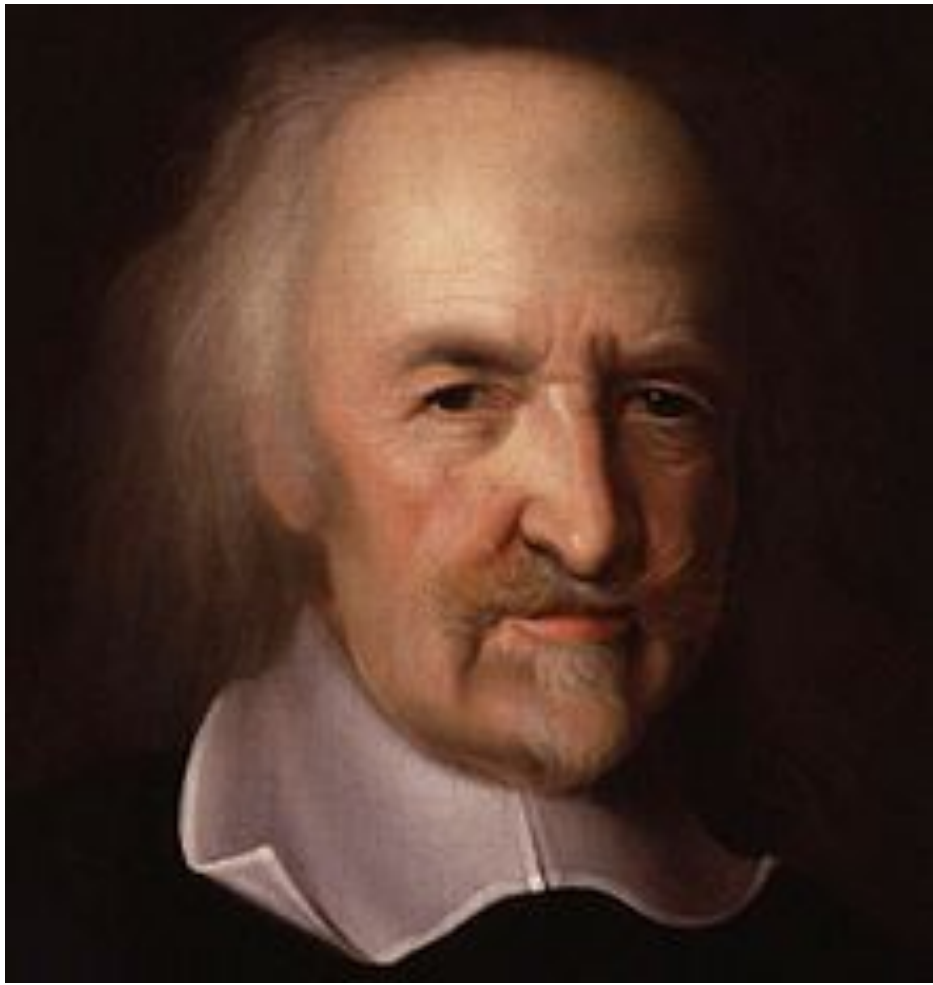
Background

- The Glorious Revolution
 - Resulted in England becoming a Constitutional Monarchy
 - Created “Bill of Rights”
 - Monarch must follow the laws made by Parliament
 - English people now had a right to a jury trial, freedom from cruel and unusual punishment



Enlightenment Thinkers

- Thomas Hobbes (1588-1679)
 - Shocked by the execution of King Charles I
 - Supported monarchy
 - Humans are naturally selfish and violent and live in a primitive “state of nature”
 - Humans cannot make wise decisions
 - Powerful leader needed to maintain order and control



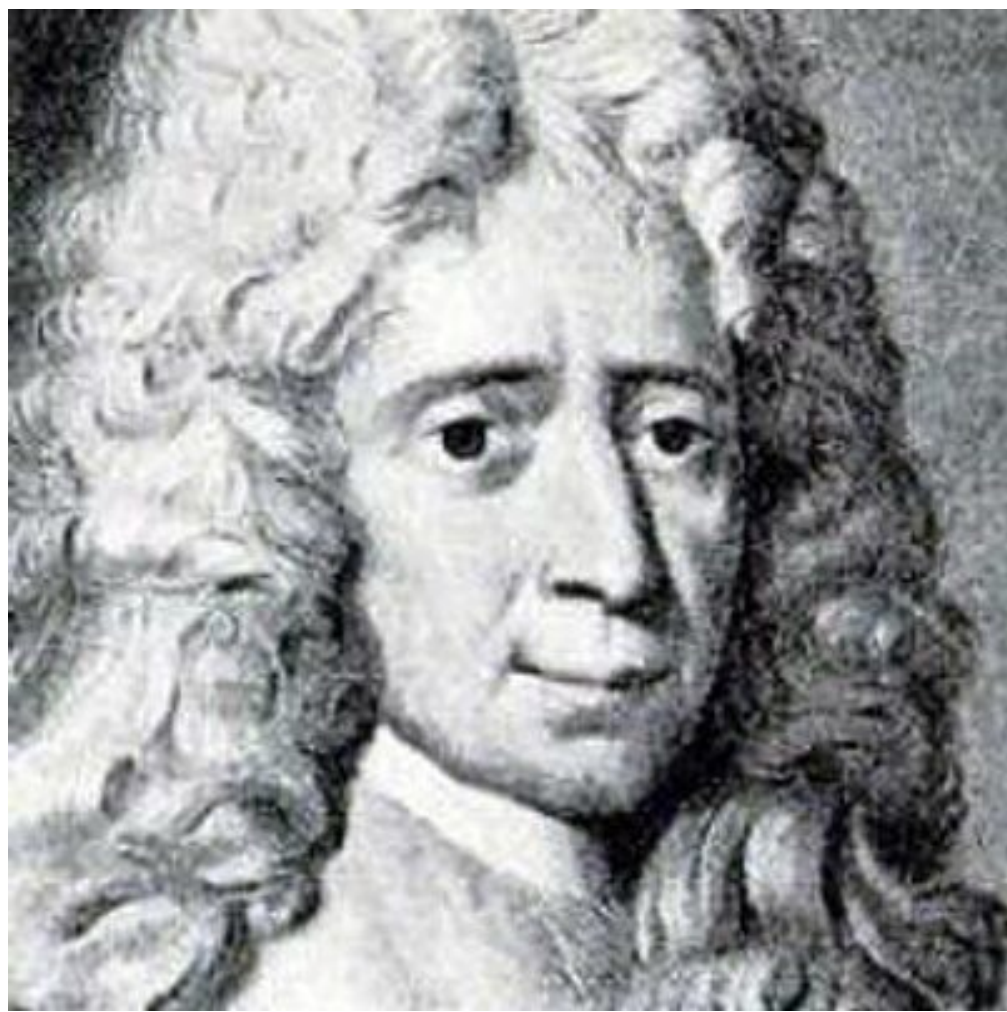
Enlightenment Thinkers

- John Locke (1632-1704)
 - Inspired by Glorious Revolution
 - Government has to answer to its citizens
 - People have natural rights (life, liberty, property)
 - Government should be based on a social contract: agreement between a government and its people



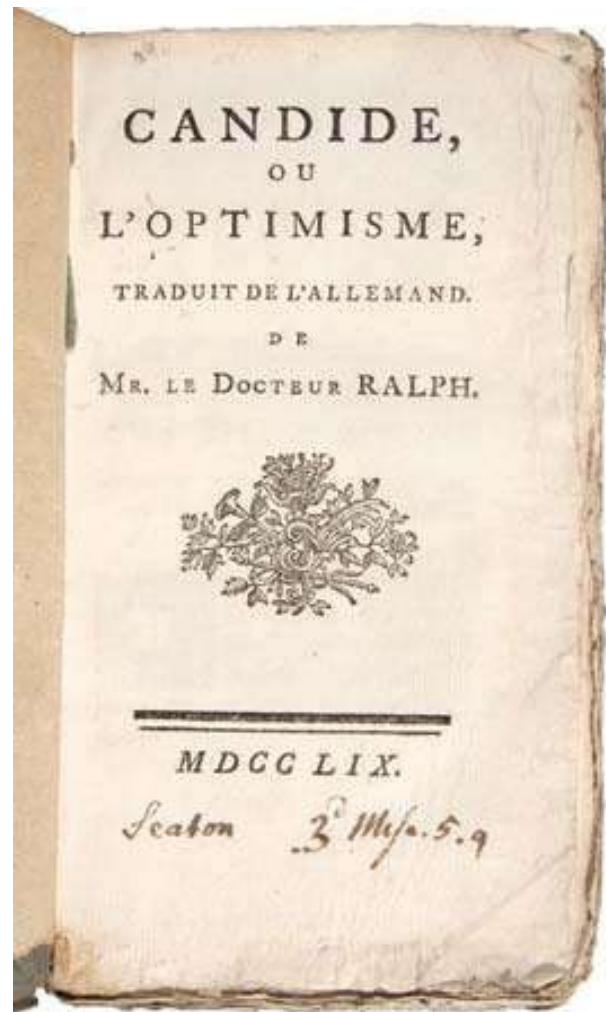
Enlightenment Thinkers

- Baron Charles-Louis Montesquieu (1689-1755)
 - *The Spirit of the Laws* (1748)
 - Political power should be shared among classes
 - Argued for separation of powers
 - Admired British government
 - Influence in France and US



Enlightenment Thinkers

- Voltaire (1694-1778)
 - Enthusiasm for English institutions
 - Wrote plays, essays, and novels
 - Supported freedom of religion
 - Deism: religion based on reason (God set everything in motion and then natural law set in)
