# Background

- Parliament vs the king:
  - 1520s: <u>King Charles I</u> refused to accept limits on <u>power</u>. Led to civil <u>war</u> and <u>execution</u>
  - 1688: <u>King James II</u> opposed Parliament trying to limit <u>power</u>; went to exile
  - 1689: William and Mary come to power in "<u>Glorious Revolution</u>"


- The Glorious Revolution
  - $\circ~$  Resulted in England becoming a


**Constitutional Monarchy** 

- Created "Bill of <u>Rights</u>"
- Monarch must follow the <u>laws</u> made by Parliament
- English people now had a right to a jury trial, freedom from <u>cruel</u> and unusual punishment



- Thomas Hobbes (1588-1679)
  - Shocked by the <u>execution</u> of King Charles I
  - $\circ \ \ Supported \ \underline{monarchy}$
  - Humans are naturally <u>selfish</u> and <u>violent</u> and live in a primitive "state of nature"
  - Humans cannot make <u>wise</u> decisions
  - <u>Powerful leader</u> needed to maintain order and control





- John Locke (1632-1704)
  - Inspired by <u>Glorious Revolution</u>
  - Government has to answer to its <u>citizens</u>
  - People have <u>natural rights</u> (life, liberty, property)
  - Government should be based on a <u>social</u> <u>contract</u>: agreement between a <u>government</u> and its <u>people</u>





- Baron Charles-Louis Montesquieu (1689-1755)
  - *The Spirit of the Laws* (1748)
  - Political <u>power</u> should be shared among <u>classes</u>
  - Argued for <u>separation of powers</u>
  - Admired <u>British</u> government
  - Influence in France and <u>US</u>





- Voltaire (1694-1778)
  - Enthusiasm for <u>English</u> institutions
  - Wrote plays, essays, and <u>novels</u>
  - Supported <u>freedom of religion</u>
  - Deism: religion based on <u>reason</u> (God set everything in motion and then natural law set in)





- Jean-Jacques Rousseau (1712-1778)
  - <u>Swiss</u>
  - Government should be based on the will of the people
  - Wrote *The Social Contract*
  - What <u>society</u> wants should be <u>law</u>
