
7.6 Explain the significance of the Qur'an and the Sunnah as the primary sources of Islamic beliefs, practice, and law and their influence in Muslims' daily life

Islam

- The <u>Qur'an</u> is Islam's holy <u>book</u>. It is word-for-word, the words Gabriel told Muhammad to <u>learn</u>
- Also is a book of the prophet Muhammad's sayings called the <u>Hadith</u> and a book detailing his actions called the <u>Sunnah</u>.
- Together, these books are the <u>guiding</u> documents for <u>Muslims</u>
- BTW, the Qur'an is written in <u>Arabic</u>, and many Muslims believe to truly understand it, you must read it in <u>Arabic</u>

The Five Pillars of Islam

• Muslims believe in <u>five</u> core duties as written in the Qur'an



The Five Pillars of Islam

• Shahada

- Accepting God
- Must say "There is no god but Allah, and Muhammad is his Prophet"
- Salah
 - Prayer
 - Muslims must face Mecca five times daily and pray
- Zakat
 - Alms
 - Means giving to the poor

The Five Pillars of Islam

• Sawm

- Fasting
- Muslims must fast during Ramadan to atone for sins
- Hajj
 - Pilgrimage
 - Able-bodied Muslims who can afford it must travel to Mecca
