Magna Carta (1215)

- Protects a noble's (wealthy men) rights
- King was not above the law
- King cannot tax without permission of a council

English Bill of Rights (1689)

- Jury trials
- No excessive (extra) bail
- Free elections to Parliament
- Free speech in Parliament

Mayflower Compact (1620)

- Compact was supreme law of the land
- "Just and equal laws"
- Provided a way to amend (or change) the document

- 2. Establish justice
- 3. Ensure domestic tranquility
- 4. Provide for the common defense
- 5. Promote the general welfare
- 6. Secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity
