- <u>Feudalism:</u> Political and social in which land was exchanged for military service and loyalty
- <u>Medieval:</u> Relating to the Middle Ages
- Manorialism: Economic system revolving around the medieval manor
- <u>Pope:</u> Leader of the Catholic church believed to be God's representative on earth
- Noble: Belonging to a higher ruling class. Aristocrat
- <u>Vassal:</u> Landowner who received land in exchange for loyalty and obedience to a noble

- <u>Knight:</u> Warrior who exchanged military service for land
- <u>Chivalry:</u> Code of honor held by medieval knights
- Fief: Small portion of land given away by a noble
- <u>Merchant:</u> traders who brought goods from one manor to another
- <u>Farmer:</u> tended the land and knew the best crop rotations for most production
- <u>Artisan:</u> craftsmen which included blacksmiths, silversmiths, jewelers, tailors, etc

- <u>Peasant:</u> worked the land and maintained the noble's estate
- <u>Serf:</u> Laborer required to work on a noble's estate (manor)
- <u>Manor:</u> noble's estate, which included a manor house or castle, village, church, and surrounding lands
- Excommunicate: Kicked out of the Catholic Church
- <u>Monastery:</u> communities where monks live, work, and dedicate themselves to their religion.
- <u>Monk:</u> Male devoted to his religion, often secluded (cut-off) from society

- Abbot: Lead priest in charge of a Catholic monastery
- <u>Latin</u>: language of the Catholic Church
- <u>Pilgrimage:</u> Trip to a place considered holy for religious reasons
- <u>Crusades:</u> holy wars conducted by Catholics in the Middle Ages to retake the holy land from Muslims
- <u>Plague:</u> highly contagious and fatal disease that spreads easily and quickly
- Reconquista: effort by Catholics to retake the Iberian Peninsula (Spain and Portugal) from Muslims

- <u>Heretic:</u> Someone expressing an opinion in opposition to the Catholic Church
- <u>Inquisition:</u> methods utilized by the Catholic Church to interrogate suspected heretics during the Reconquista
