## Course Description

The high school World History course provides students with a comprehensive, intensive study of major events and themes in world history. Students begin with a study of the earliest civilizations worldwide and continue to examine major developments and themes in all regions of the world. The course culminates in a study of change and continuity and globalization at the beginning of the 21st century.

### Classroom Management

Students are expected to be prepared for class. This includes: bringing their World History notebook to class, having necessary writing utensils (pen or pencil), and bringing completed assignments. Students are expected to arrive **on time** to class each day and behave in a respectful manner towards the teachers and other students. Continuous disruptive behavior will result in the progressive steps to discipline as listed below. Instruction occurs from bell to bell, and students are expected to remain seated until dismissed by the teacher and should not at any time congregate near the door in preparation for dismissal. Students will be placed in assigned seats and seats are subject to change at any time.

## Progressive Steps to Discipline

3<sup>rd</sup> Infraction and above - Discipline referral to administration

\*\*\*All major infractions (fighting, harassment, blatant disrespect, etc.) will result in a referral to administration. There are no exceptions to this rule.

#### Late Work

Assignments turned in after the due date are subject to point deductions at the discretion of the teacher. Exceptions will be given to students with documented accommodations or those with prior teacher approval. On <u>most</u> late assignments a 10 point deduction will be enforced.

#### Dress Code

The dress code is outlined in the student handbook. Students out of dress code will be directed to the office.

## Eating and Drinking in the Classroom

School Policy states that students are not to eat or drink in the classroom. This means no food items including gum and candy. The only exception to this rule is bottled water. Students will be warned once; after further infractions, the item(s) will be confiscated. (Miss Mara does not want ants in her classroom!!)

## Absences/Make-Up Procedures

Students will be responsible for making up missed work in a timely manner after an absence. Students should see the teacher to collect missed materials and work on the day that they return from an absence. Remember, on your 3<sup>rd</sup> absence you will be referred to the counselor/Attendance Support Team. If you have more than six unexcused absences or more than six parent-excused absences, you will be referred to Saturday School.

MPORTANT: You must still take previously scheduled assessments at the scheduled time. For example, if on Tuesday I announce that we will have a test on a Friday, and you are absent on a Wednesday and/or Thursday, you still need to take the test on Friday.

#### Passes

Each student will have 4 passes for each nine weeks. After the passes are used, no more hall privileges will be assigned. The school-wide 20/20 rule is in effect, which means that no passes will be issued within 20 minutes of the beginning or end of class.

### Technology in the Classroom

Technology use in the classroom is a privilege that all students are allowed until it is abused. iPads will be used with responsibility according to the school-wide policy. Abuse will result in the revocation of technology privileges. Cell phones are prohibited by the school rules. Students will be warned once; after further infractions, the device(s) will be confiscated. For further questions, reference the student handbook.
